A 24-bed group home, located at 3 Rees St., on the southwest corner of the Buffalo Psychiatric Center campus.



Grant Street Residence (SOCR)

A 14-bed group home located at Grant St. and Letchworth Ave., a short distance from the main Buffalo Psychiatric Center campus.



Waterfront Residence (SOCR)

A 14-bed group home located in Celoron, outside of Jamestown in Chautauqua County, that serves individuals recovering from mental illness and chemical abuse.

adults of all social, financial, ethnic, and educational backgrounds who are recovering from a serious mental illness.

Accepted applicants...

- ◆ Have a primary diagnosis of mental illness
- ◆ Are 18 years of age or older
- ◆ Demonstrate safety in behavior toward self and others
- ◆ Independently--or with minimal prompting--take care of daily needs, including hygiene, continence, diet, and medical treatments
- ◆ Have the potential to improve functional skills
- ◆ Are competent to make medical decisions or have a Health Care Proxy established.
- ◆ Agree to adhere to an individual residential service plan
- ◆ Meet the requirements of capability for self preservation
- ◆ Agree to follow the rules and regulations of the residence



Strozzi Residence (SOCR)

A 27-bed residence located in the Strozzi Building on the main campus.



Cudmore Heights Residential Care Center for Adults (RCCA)

Located on the main Buffalo Psychiatric Center campus.
